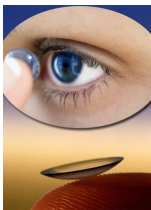

Is It "Pink Eye" Doctor?



Pink eye is a general term for a red eye, or conjunctivitis, however several different things can cause it. Most cases of conjunctivitis are caused by bacteria, allergy, or viral infections, and a careful eye exam in necessary to determine the cause for proper treatment. Antibiotics eye drops are often over-prescribed, since they have no effect on viral or allergic eye disease.

Symptoms of Conjunctivitis in one or both eyes include:

- Red eye
- Swollen, itching, or burning eyes
- Tearing or discharge
- Crusting of the eyelids
- Sensitivity to light
- Blurred vision
